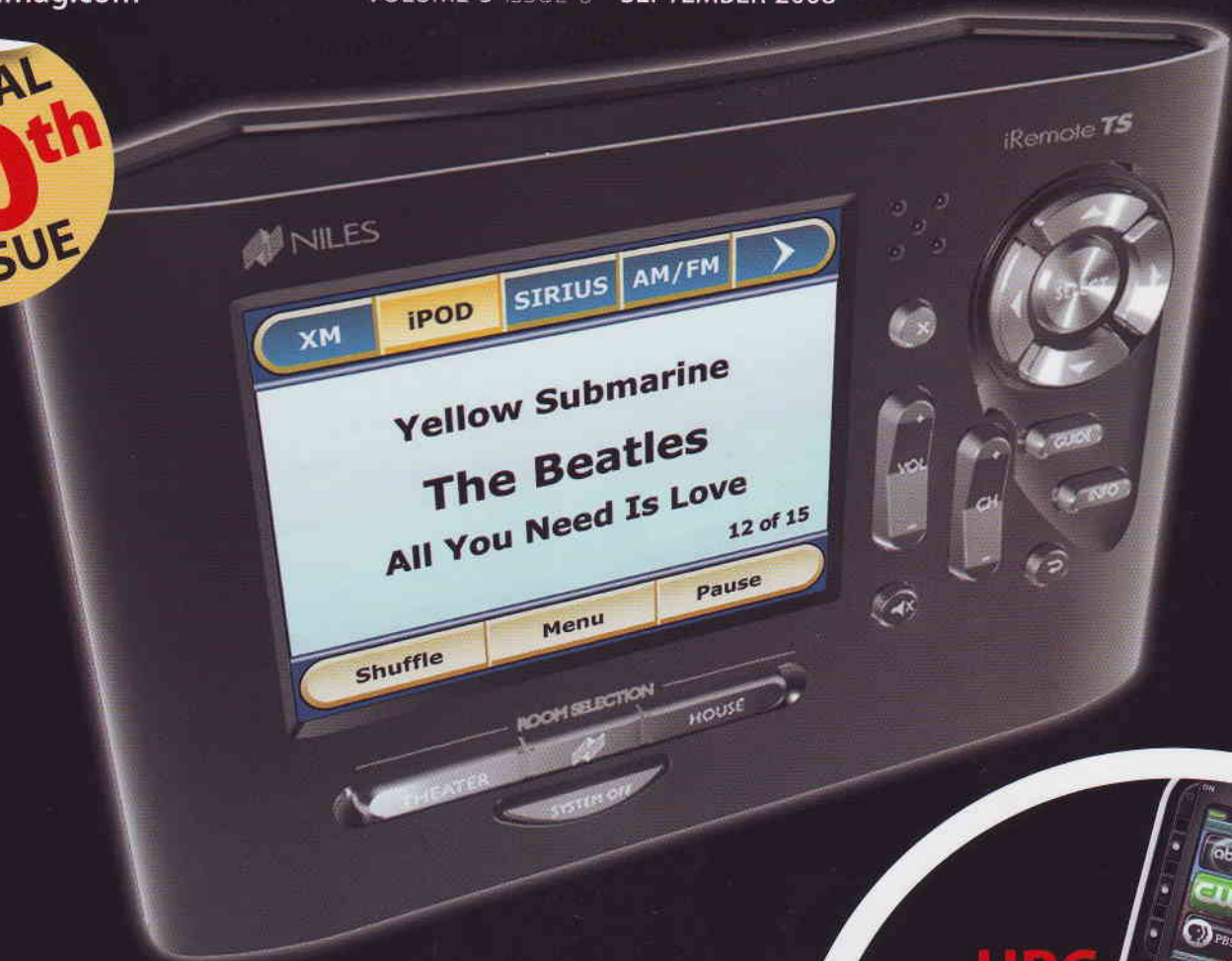

Amina's Invisible Plaster In-wall Loudspeakers have recently been installed, to much acclaim, at the world-famous Cuvilliez Theatre in Munich.

This heritage Rokoko venue, part of the German National theatre, needed a new audio system to meet government regulations and audience demands. In addition, it also had to comply with strict conservation guidelines.
